

5. WRITE A SIMPLE PLAN:

Example plan:

1. The story is set on a dead planet.
2. The hero's name is Max and the villain's name is Ghost.
3. Max needs to find a time-key to bring the planet back to life.
4. Ghost also wants to get the key, which will give him ultimate power.
5. The two first come face to face in an abandoned weapons dump when...

Story-writing tips:

1. Don't plan too much! Just plan enough to get the 'shape' of your story.
2. You can also write down things for your characters to say in the plan.
3. When your plan is finished, read it back carefully and tweak it.
4. When you are happy with your plan, start writing your story in full.
